BIG RED BEHAVIOR BINDERS

General Tips for Decreasing Impulsive Behavior

- The use of modeling can be an effective approach. Have classmates demonstrate the correct behavior and deliver reinforcers to initiate the imitating behavior in the child.
- Maintain verbal contact with the child until assistance can be provided. (e.g., "Thank you for waiting quietly. I'll be there shortly".)
- Coordinate with other teachers and school personnel to ensure that expectations for the student are school wide and consistent, and that the action taken in each classroom will reinforce the other.
