Procedures:	🖥️ Define character traits to the students. Characters are an important element of a story. The traits of a character can

	<p>be stated, or they can be shown to the reader by the characters actions. For example, when you are reading a story, the writer might tell you that the main character is a generous person. The writer could also show you that the character is generous by telling about a time when the character was generous. Well-developed characters help to make very powerful stories.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>🖥️ Listen to the interactive story of Jack and the Beanstalk. <a href="http://www.bbc.co.uk/cbeebies/storycircle/fairystories/jackbeanstalk/jack_s.shtml">http://www.bbc.co.uk/cbeebies/storycircle/fairystories/jackbeanstalk/jack_s.shtml</a></li> <li>🖥️ Together discuss Jack's character traits by showing the sample of the Bio PowerPoint about Jack. Ex. Adjectives .... Who he loves... What he wants .... What he gives ..... Who he fears ..... Who'd like to .....</li> <li>🖥️ Explain to the students that they are going to complete a Bio PowerPoint about their character traits.</li> <li>🖥️ Explain that a "bio" is a way for you to introduce yourself to others by giving character traits about yourself (your thoughts, feelings, and beliefs).</li> <li>🖥️ Encourage the students to write complete sentences for each slide.</li> <li>🖥️ Once all the context is in the Bio PowerPoint, allow the students to format their slides by add background, formatting text, and adding clip art.</li> <li>🖥️ Students will present their Bio PowerPoint to the class using the TV connected to a computer.</li> </ul>
