



Student



- Students must abide by the <u>student code of conduct</u> for dress code and behavior expectations.
- If students are struggling, have questions, or need help, they should reach out to the teacher via email or the OnCourse message platform.
- Interventions, office hours, and ZOOM meetings will be mandatory for struggling students.

Student



- Students are still home-based at a school.
- Those schools will receive notices, test scores, and information regarding your status.
- Students must attend state testing in the Spring. This is mandatory to remain in the program moving forward.
- Remember: mandatory check in every morning at 7:45am-8:00am



This is how you attend LIVE class.

- Teachers will set up ZOOM sessions to conduct lessons throughout the day.
- Students are responsible for attending the lessons.
- Teachers will email and post information and schedules in the OnCourse platform.

- It is important for students to actively participate and engage in content and lessons when they are online.
- Virtual students are required to participate in ZOOM via the chat feature, breakout room, poll feature, or interactive question and answer time.
- Students are required to show their face on camera and be dressed in a school uniform at all times.

- All assignments must be completed by the deadline.
- Please complete and submit work in a timely manner.
- Not completing assignments have negative impacts on grades.
- Students who are struggling will be required to attend intervention time or office hour sessions for additional information and guidance.

Mandatory attendance/roll call every morning!



- Students must log into OnCourse daily.
- Teachers will track attendance daily, weekly, and monthly.
- Teachers will reach out to students who are not completing assignments via email, phone call, text message, and parent contact.



Truancy Court is in effect for virtual students! Don't miss attendance check in each morning!



- Students can and will be reported to Truancy Court for not attending lessons, not completing assignments, or not participating in the virtual learning program as directed.
- Attendance is mandatory.



- Check your email daily!!

Student Chromebooks!



- Charge your Chromebook everyday!
- Be prepared to perform any updates.
- This might be a Google update or a Chrome update.
- Charge Chromebooks early, so they are ready for the start of school.
- You must bring your Chromebook to your home base site for any technology issues.

- Not all Jump Start pathways are available virtually.
- Only pathways include:
 - Arts, AV Technology and Communications
 - Business Management
 - Transportation, Distribution, and Logistics
 - Information Technology





- Dual enrollment and advanced placement courses are limited to what is available through the Supplemental Course Academy.
- Examples: Welding and AG are not offered.

- Live lessons will be conducted for high school students.
- Work must be completed on time.
- Attendance check in everyday!
- Interventions and office hours are used to assist students.





- Students must work with the home- based counselor in addition to the virtual program to ensure progress towards credits and graduation.
- Home-based counselor determines the student's schedule.
- Virtual counselor works with the home-based school to meet the student's needs.

PBIS Expectations provide a framework of positive behaviors that we expect from all of our teachers and students both in and out of the classroom. Students receive "virtual tickets" when they are observed displaying program expectations.

- Check OnCourse Connect to monitor assignments.
- Check JCampus to monitor attendance and grades.
- Check your email daily!
- Email the teacher!!!
- Call the teacher!!!
- Provide assistance with your child as needed.
- Adhere to deadlines to avoid grade consequences.

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- Students in K-6 should have an adult learning partner present during ZOOM lessons and to assist students with videos and assignments.
- Remember students must wake up and log in everyday!
 Please assist us with ensuring your child participates in as normal a schedule as possible.
- Provide a designated work space for your child.

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- Encourage others to respect the time designated for instruction and completing assigned tasks.
- Ensure your child has your current and correct contact information.
- Ensure your child follows the <u>student code of conduct</u> for dress code and behavior expectations.
- Make sure your child knows about the <u>AUP</u>.

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Teacher Expectations



- Will provide assignments, lessons, videos, and ZOOM meetings.
- Will check email multiple times daily.
- Will have engaging lessons and motivate students to excel.
- Will provide ongoing feedback to students.
- Will ask questions throughout lessons to check for understanding.
- Will provide rigorous student work and assignments.
- Will offer office hours and interventions daily for students.
- Will call parents weekly as needed.






- Should you choose to change from virtual to traditional, the deadline is July 4.
